


A590 M6 junction 36 to Brettargh Holt improvements

September to December 2020



In autumn 2020, we will deliver a number of maintenance and improvement schemes on the A590, between M6 junction 36 and Brettargh Holt roundabout. Together they will ensure safer, more reliable journeys for years to come.

The major part of the work will see the reconstruction of the carriageway along this stretch. We'll be removing the top 32cm (12.5 inches) of road surface before laying down a new one.

We'll also be:

- resurfacing the roundabout at M6 junction 36
- replacing drainage facilities
- replacing the bridge joints
- widening the A590 entry slip at Brettargh Holt roundabout
- improving road markings
- replacing sections of safety barrier on the A590

What we've done so far


Preparation work is currently taking place on the A6 at Borwick roundabout. We're planning further work at A591 Shenstone roundabout. This includes creating breaks in the central barrier, allowing us to set up contraflow systems, ensuring the diversion routes are suitable for all traffic when full closures are needed. Dates for our planned closures are shown on the plans overleaf.



Traffic management

M6 junction 36 roundabout – 24 hour closure of southern section

From 14 September to 10 October, the southern section of the M6 junction 36 roundabout will be closed. This will allow us to repair the bridge joints at this location. Also, the closure will ensure traffic flows smoothly from the M6 junction 36 northbound exit slip onto the A590 westbound carriageway. This will stop traffic building up on the M6 carriageway. Diversion routes will be in place throughout.





What is a contraflow?

A contraflow system is where a lane of traffic is running in the opposite direction to the other lanes on that carriageway. Drivers will see a temporary barrier between them and oncoming traffic. A reduced speed limit will be in place to ensure motorists travel through the contraflow safely. Two lanes will continue to run in both directions.

A contraflow will be in place on the A590 eastbound between Brettargh Holt roundabout and M6 junction 36 from 14 September to 7 October. This will then switch over to the westbound from 10 to 24 October.

Innovative ways of working

Approximately 60,000 tonnes of asphalt material is needed for this scheme, 43,000 tonnes of which will be recycled. This will be made at our onsite production facility. By recycling the old carriageway into new asphalt, we will:

- reduce carbon emissions by 45%
- significantly reduce the number of haulage deliveries
- work up to 24-hours a day, completing our work as quickly as possible
- reduce overall disruption for our customers and the local community

Closure dates

Closure of junction 36 roundabout and A590 eastbound between Brettargh Holt to M6 junction 36

- 4 to 13 September
- 25 October to 3 November


Closure of A590 westbound between Brettargh Holt to M6 junction 36

- 4 to 6 September
- 11 to 13 September
- 25 October to 3 November

Note: further closures are needed here towards the end of the work. Updates will be available on our webpage.

Planned closures

To ensure that we can set up our work areas to make all these improvements, we'll need to install some traffic management, such as contraflows or full road closures. The plans below show the location of our planned overnight closures, their respective diversion routes and the dates they will be in place.
