| <b>SYSTEM DESCRIPTION:</b>          | A non-flush dry sanitation system using wind power and radiant heat to accelerate the treatment process.   |
| <b>SPECIFICATION:</b>               | As included in the supporting documents.   |
| <b>SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS:</b>        | Application of 9 September 1998 and supporting documents.<br>Letter of 2 November 1998 from applicant and supporting documents.<br>Letter of 17 November 1998 from applicant and supporting documents.   |
| <b>CONDITIONS OF ACCREDITATION:</b> | <p>The accreditation of the Enviro Loo waterless composting toilet system Models 2010 and 2040 is interim only at this stage. This interim accreditation allows for up to 3 systems of each model to be installed. Each system is to undergo a minimum of 12 month testing arranged in conjunction with the relevant council and paid for by the applicant.</p> <p>The system shall not be installed in a plumbing installation other than in accordance with the conditions of a <i>Special Connection Permit</i> issued by the relevant Council under the <i>Plumbing Regulations 1994</i>. The conditions of the <i>Special Connection Permit</i> shall include the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All plumbing work installed in connection with the system must comply with the <i>Tasmanian Plumbing Code</i>.</li> </ul> |

- Each system must be installed in accordance with clause Tas F2.102 of the *Building Code of Australia*.
- Each system to be installed and operated (generally) in accordance with *NSW Health Department Waterless Composting Toilets Approval Guidelines*.
- The owner of the system must enter into and maintain a Maintenance Contract with the Council or the Manufacturer [or a Council approved person].
- The Owner must enter into an Agreement with the Council to maintain a required Maintenance Contract with the Manufacturer [or a Council approved person] . The Agreement is to be binding on future owners and be registered against the land. [Section 55 of the *Local Government (Building and Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1993*]
- The Manufacturer [or a Council approved person] must advise the Council immediately upon default of an Owner in not maintaining the Maintenance Contract.

**NOTE:**

In the event of an Owner's default in failing to comply with the conditions of the Special Connection Permit, the Council may take action to obtain compliance in accordance with the *Plumbing Regulations 1994*.
