#1: TOWARDS CULTURAL COMPETENCE: ENGAGING IN OTHER CULTURES
Sr. Gwynette Proctor, SNDdeN, Director, Office of Black Catholics, Archdiocese of Baltimore

Explore the foundations of racism and offer practical steps to raising one's consciousness level toward becoming culturally competent. Increase awareness of how to communicate *appropriately and effectively* with persons and groups in cultures other than one's own. Gain the ability to identify and articulate patterns of prejudice and racism that impede group interaction. Identify obstacles to effective communication across cultures.

#2: IMMIGRATION IN AN INDIFFERENT WORLD
