

- Long-term benefits envisioned due to participation in the program.

To ensure the proper learning environment, the program's steering committee will select suitable candidates from individuals nominated by their firm. Member firms may nominate as many individuals as they wish. However, the member firm will be obligated only for candidates selected.

Successful applicants will be notified by Monday, December 5, 2022, and will be billed for the cost of the program. The investment for this significant and extensive training is \$1,895.00 per person, which includes: Registration and resource materials for <u>all</u> sessions. All class participants completing the course will be presented with a certificate, that includes a maximum of 20 PDHs, at the ACEC/MD banquet Friday evening during the annual conference, at the Westin in Annapolis.
