Dr. Tara Baldisera is a family physician with a focused practice in concussionmanagement. She is Medical Director of Sudbury Sport and Exercise Medicine Concussion Clinic - a medically supervised interdisciplinary concussion management team providing care to recreational and elite athletes and pursuing research as it relates to interdisciplinary concussion care in Northern Ontario. She is an Associate Professor at the Northern Ontario School of Medicine. She is an active member of the Family Medicine Department at Health Sciences North.

Dr. Jairus Quesnele is a chiropractic clinical sciences specialist and researcher with a focus in concussion management and spine rehabilitation. He is the Rehabilitation Director of Sudbury Sport and Exercise Medicine Concussion Clinic, a medically supervised concussion management and research team. He has completed a secondment at World Health Organization as a Fellow in Health Classifications and Standards in Geneva, Switzerland and is an Associate Professor at the Northern Ontario School of Medicine.

Shannon Kenrick-Rochon is a Nurse Practitioner with a Primary Care Specialty certificate. She completed a fellowship with the Registered Nursing Association of Ontario focused on Concussion presentations to the Emergency Department. Currently Shannon holds academic appointments with Cambrian College, Laurentian University and the Northern Ontario School of Medicine. She maintains community practice in primary care and in an inter professional team focused on Exercise medicine and concussion care. Her research focus is on the inter professional management of concussion and development of inter professional competencies in post secondary education.
