OLD WEST STORY AT PARAMOUNT

Wallace Beery and Marjorie Main
Main Co-star in Action
Drama

A fast-action melodrama of the Old West is "Jackass Mail," which will open today at the Paramount Theatre.

Wallace Beery and Marjorie Main are starred in the outdoor opus, marking their fourth appearance together. They provide the laugh highlights of the film with their lighthearted, blundering love scenes.

Beery plays "Just" Baggot, who escapes a hanging party to land in

the mining town of Gold Creek. Marjorie Main is the driver of the "Jackass Mail," which carries large shipments of gold from the town. Beery sets out to woo her and win the gold but eventually falls in love with the hard-spoken, soft-hearted woman.

Through a series of accidents Beery becomes the town hero and they renounce the village "Baggot City" in his honor. This is the final blow to Beery's outlaw ambitions and he settles down to a life of respectability by marrying the file-voiced Miss Main.

Notable performances are turned in by Darryl Hickman and J. Carroll Naish. Young Hickman, portraying the son of a bad man slain by Beery, emerges as one of Hollywood's best child actors.

Darryl Hickman's acting career came about through a natural talent for singing and dancing. At the age of four, his mother encouraged his love of music and enrolled him in a dancing school. While applying for a dancing part in "The Stormmaker," the boy was noticed by Bing Crosby, who urged that he be given an acting part.

Director Norman MacLeod has kept the action moving at a rapid pace. The comedy moments are handled lightly and amusingly.

Magnificent outdoor scenes were shot by Clyde De Vinna, the rugged California country providing an awe-inspiring background for the action of the story.

'The Corpse Vanishes' Opening at the Empire

Thrills of an unusually hair-raising variety are provided in "The Corpse Vanishes," the Monogram drama which will open an engagement at the Empire Theatre tomorrow. The film represents the "horror" picture at its best.

Bela Lugosi appears in the starring role, and contributes an outstanding performance in the type of role which he knows so well how to handle. In the story he is a strange creature who successively abducts a number of young brides who have apparently died from the effects of a powerful drug, and puts them to a use which is horrifying and at the same time pseudo-scientific.

The action which culminates in an absorbing climax carries a high degree of interest as it follows the machinations of the evil Lugosi, and the picture qualifies as a completely successful effort.

The cast supporting the star is talented throughout, and includes many well-known Hollywood players. Among those who do especially good work are Luana Walters, Joan Barclay, Tristram Coffin, Minerva Urecal, Gwen Kenyon, Gladys Faye and Vince Barnett. Director Wallace Fox has been most successful in maintaining suspense and creating an atmosphere of horror, and has contributed importantly to the success of the picture.

Society Editor Dies

NEW YORK, July 17 (AP)—Maury H. B. Paul, 32, who as "Cholly Knickerbocker" recorded for years the activities of New York's first families as society editor for the New York Journal-American, died today in his home after a 10-week illness caused by heart ailment.

Paul was a native of Philadelphia. After attending Episcopal Academy and University of Pennsylvania, he became a reporter for the Philadelphia Times in 1914.

That same year he found his reporting talents lay in the field of society doings and he came to New York.

Besides chronicling society for the Journal-American and a daily syndicated column, Paul wrote magazine articles about the socialites and celebrities he knew well.
