Since the CORONAVIRUS-19 pandemic began, the Bronx Community College Library Access Services, Archives, Content Services, Learning/Instruction Services, and Technology Services have continued to support the educational mission of Bronx Community College and the mission(s) of the CUNY Office of Library Services for discovery, critical thinking, and learning through instructional initiatives that develop skills for information discovery, scholarship, and academic excellence. Working collaboratively with faculty, students, and the college community, the Library Department will continue to challenge our learners to consider their role as consumers, producers, and creators of information. Learners will be empowered to effectively identify, find, evaluate, create, and ethically use information in their academic pursuits, in their future careers, and as life-long learners in an information-rich society.

ACCESS / ACCOUNTS

Seating by Reservation - Hours –

The onsite SERVICE offerings include single seating for **quiet study and quiet computing** (i.e., no teleconferencing and no online course participation) and limited printing, scanning, copy services.

Reservations will be available only to BCC students, faculty, and staff. Only the main floor of the BCC Library, (the “Commons”) and eight of the study rooms will be available. Seating will be limited to about 50% capacity for social distancing allowance and effective facility management.

- **All seating will be via reservation only.**
- There will be single seating sessions available with a 24-hour advance reservation.
- Cancellations will be automatic after a 15-minute grace period.
- No same-day reservations/re-entries will be allowed in order to fairly balance access/use.

Saturday/Sunday – TBD for Nov./Dec. – dependent on additional staffing

PPS will also need to sanitize a second time (either mornings or evenings), beyond the mid-day schedule detailed above, to prepare the spaces fully for safe occupancy.

Library Facility appointments/reservations -

Virtual Service Hours -

It is informed by the current reduced staffing reality and the teleworking options made available across CUNY. It responds to the course scheduling patterns offered by the college. *Synchronous and asynchronous reference and instructional services will all be done in a distanced digital mode across these hours:

Friday | 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. (VIRTUAL SERVICES ONLY)

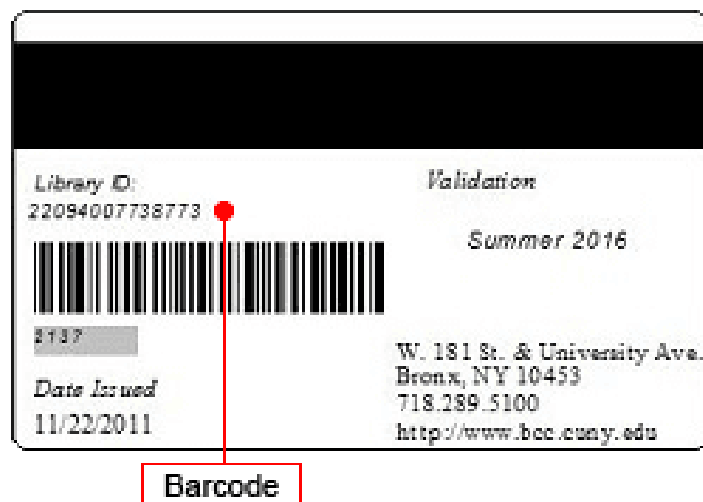
(Saturday and Sunday hours will be added in Nov. and Dec. if adjunct library faculty and staff can be hired as needed.)

ID Activation -

Your “OneSearch” BCC Library account -

Go to the BCC Library website and choose the “OneSearch” tab, then click on the grey “Search” button. Inside OneSearch, click on the “Sign in” link. Get into your account by using your CUNY login credentials [e.g. first.last##@login.cuny.edu & CUNY password].



CIRCULATION / BORROWING / E-CONTENT

Circulating items & Renewals -

Books and items that you have already will renew automatically.

Books can be returned to the Book Drop which is just to right of (upon entering) the main (center) quad entrance of North Hall. (Do not put items in the trash compactors! Those are out on the sidewalk away from the “front porch.”)

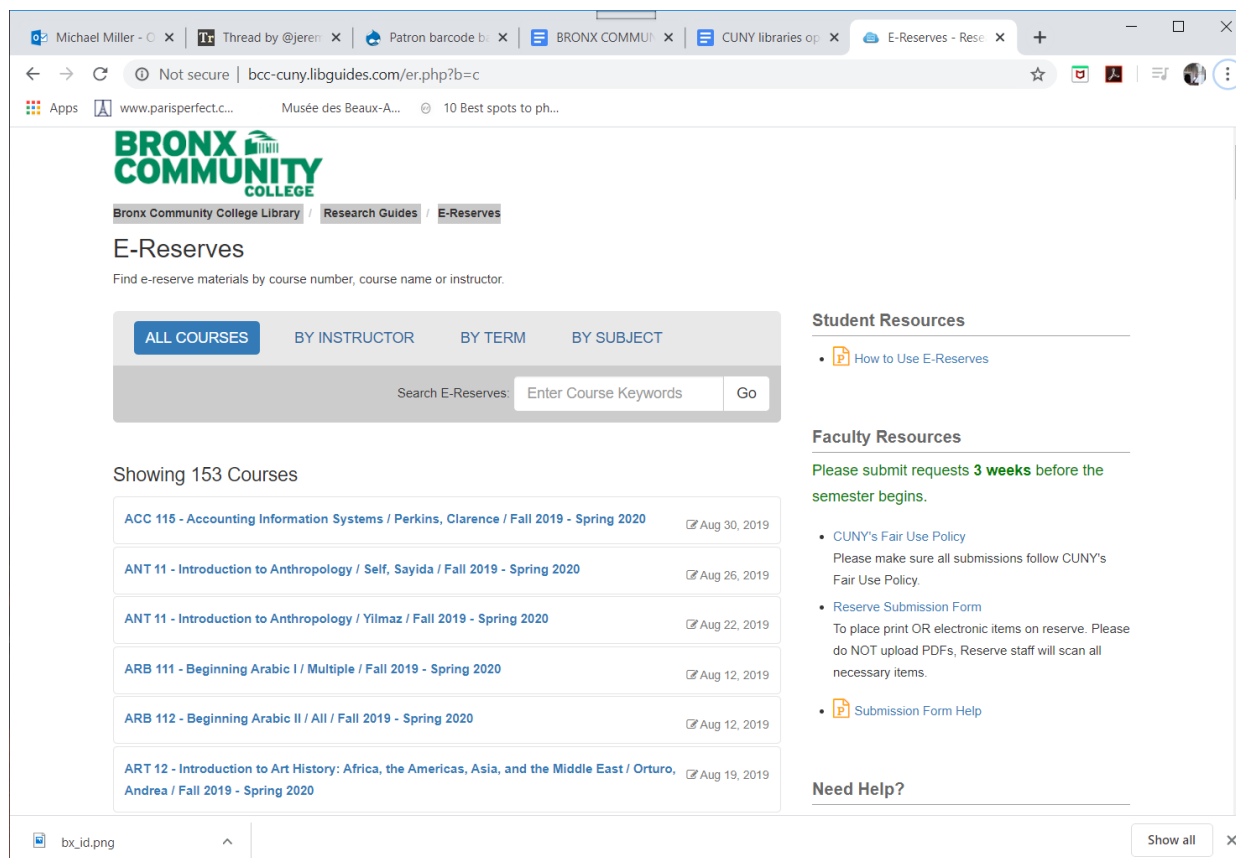
Fines -

All books and items taken out or that are due during this COVID-19 period (March 11th, 2020 forward) will not accumulate fines. All fines levied from before the COVID-19 period (March 10, 2020 and before) will stand.

E-reserves -

Textbook chapters previously requested for upload are still available.

Go to the BCC_Library website and choose the “EReserves” tab, then click on the grey “Search” button for access by course number or instructor.

Inter-Library Loan & CLICS (Other CUNY) -

Requests can now be made to get materials from the BCC collection, other CUNY libraries, and Inter-Library Loan. We are instituting a “curb-side pick-up” procedure so that you have access to all materials that arrive for you.

Use OneSearch® for BCC and other CUNY titles to be transferred to BCC for “Curbside Pick-up”

Use ILLiad® to gain access to materials not owned by CUNY. Submit ILLiad requests [here](#).

E-mail and other notifications generated by LibCal® should be used to arrange for pick-up and service appointments.

BlackBoard uploads/linking -

Professors: Scanned book chapters and article .pdfs can be uploaded to course BlackBoard sites. (Remember copyright: Put up one at a time; take the older one down before uploading the newest file.)

Professors: Article permalinks can be added to course syllabi. Go to the BCC_Library website and choose the “Articles/Databases” tab, then click on the grey “Search” button to see all databases. Search in a database to find articles. In the search results, click on an article title to display the “Permalink” option for the article. Copy and paste that Permalink URL into your syllabus.

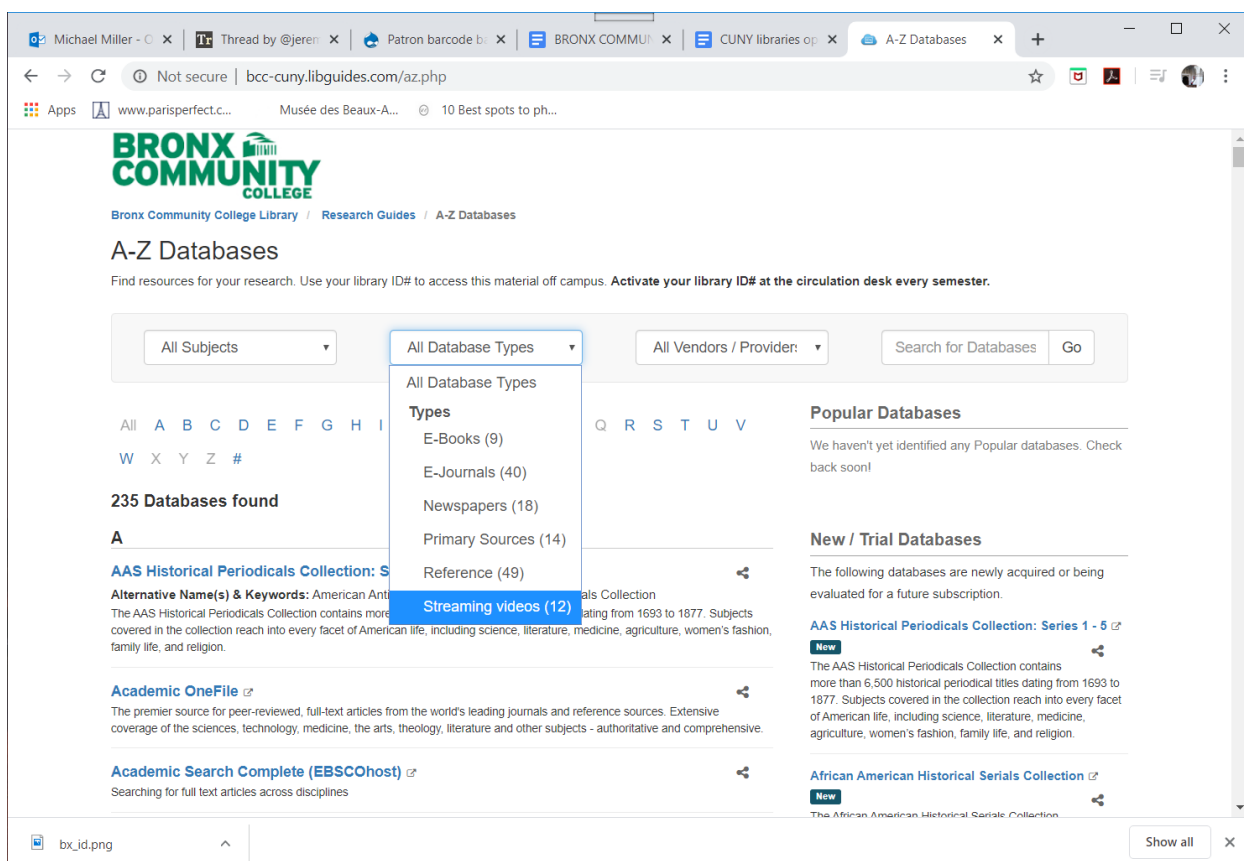
