Livingstone College Worship & Preaching Institute

As a preacher, there are preachers whom I admire. They are varied in all the ways that make humanity the most interesting box of crayons in creation. As I lean into traveling just over the downside of this hill called life, I have outlined my intention to travel to see some of my favorites on this side of the chilly Jordan. Every once in a while, God creates serendipitous meetings between preparation and opportunity. You find yourself with the opportunity to see some of your favorites, and you only have to go right down the street.

For the last two years, that has been the case for me. Livingstone College's Worship and Preaching Institute, held at 530 Jake Alexander Blvd., brings some of the nation's top black preachers to Salisbury, North Carolina, in a big way. Last year, there were Bishop Vashti McKenzie, the first Woman Bishop of the A.M.E. Church, and Dr. Melva Sampson, Assistant Teaching Professor of Preaching and Practical Theology at Wake Forest School of Divinity.

I met and mingled with the prolific pontificator, Dr. Lance A. Watson, this year. Dr. Watson is the pastor of St. Paul's Missionary Baptist Church in Richmond, Va. I've never been to St. Paul's Missionary Baptist Church, but I have seen Dr. Watson numerous times on television. When I first started watching him, his hair was a little thicker and his waistline was a little thinner, but the commitment to and passion for the word of God did not change. I was inspired and encouraged by our brief conversation.

Meeting Dr. Tori Butler, Adjunct Professor of Pastoral Theology at Hood Theological Seminary, was a revelation. I had the *intense* pleasure of taking a class with Dr. Butler during J-Term. Since the DMin classroom is virtual, this was the first time I met her in person. Underneath that diminutive stature is one tough professor. She pushed me. I needed pushing. At the Institute, Dr. Butler introduced the audience to "the Holler" and its place in her work surrounding grief.

There were so many powerful preachers and teachers involved in the Institute that it could not all be contained in one place. The partnership with Hood Theological Seminary this year brought workshops to our campus. Gail Estella led one such seminar. It was titled "Through It All". Gail Estella is a survivor of Domestic Violence and has 33 years of sobriety under her belt. She shared heart-wrenching stories of trials and triumphs, loss, and regret with her audience. But finally, the victory that comes when you put your life in the Savior's hands. She grounded her stories in Psalm 34, encouraging the audience to use their voice. She reminded us that when God uses God's voice, things happen. When Jesus used His voice, things happened. We must also use our voices to make things happen. We were all encouraged to do just that.

Our Senior Bishop, the Right Reverend Darryl B. Starnes also presented at the institute. He spoke about the church as a Movement from the Pulpit to the Streets. "There must be some movement in us that propels us to move for God, to the benefit of others. That movement is the indwelling *and* the filling of the Holy Spirit. If we are not *filled* with the Holy Spirit, everything we do will be for our benefit. Once we yield to the Holy Spirit and grow, He moves us to come out of our comfort zones, to reach the people around us, to reach the people beyond us, to reach the ones who have been thrown away-the outcasts-and He will even move us to the ends of the earth."

The Institute culminated in the induction of twenty-one preachers into the Bishop Alfred G. Dunston College of Preachers [three posthumously]. Bishop Dunston was known for his charismatic and passionate preaching. The preacher they chose for this prestigious event is also known for his charismatic and passionate preaching; Rev. Dr. Reginald W. Sharpe Jr. I first became aware of Dr. Sharpe when he was preaching for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes at his High School, through a YouTube search. I returned frequently to the YouTube Channel. I watched as he graduated, went to Morehouse, went to grad school, and became the pastor of Fellowship Baptist Church in Chicago.

I encountered Rev. Sharpe virtually in 2021 when Dr. Andre' Resner invited me (and other students) to preach for a class he taught for the PhD Program in African American Preaching & Sacred Rhetoric at Christian Theological Seminary. The facilitator of the discussion of the sermon that I preached was none other than that kid who was no longer a kid that I had been watching since he was a kid! Thanks to the Livingstone College Worship and Preaching Institute, I have finally met my internet nephew!

Dr. Sharp preached a fiery and dynamic sermon titled "Notes from the Nets" (Luke chapter 5). In his unique way, Dr. Sharpe encouraged the inductees into the Bishop Alfred G. Dunston Colleges of Preachers. He admonished that "if you think you're too big to do something little, then you're probably too little to do something big." He reminded us not to judge Peter just because he was tired. They had been out all night and caught nothing. Many of us have been so tired from the work that we had no energy to try again. Then Rev. Sharpe did the thing that makes his preaching unique. He gave voice to the *nets* in this passage of scripture. The nets reminded us that it is challenging to carry something so heavy that its weight makes you question whether you can even hold yourself together. Rev. Sharpe preached us right into a reset of heart and mind. "They Like to Never Quit Praising God."

The Livingstone College Worship and Preaching Institute was a cornucopia of preaching and teaching excellence. I look forward to what its next iteration will bring to the lives of students, preachers, and teachers of the word of God.
