## **Guidance to Raise Your Voice on Obesity Care**

Addressing the obesity epidemic requires engagement from advocates like you. You're a critical voice to help policymakers understand challenges and solutions around obesity care - and see obesity as a chronic disease that results in health consequences.



100 million adults & nearly 15 million children in the United States live with obesity.<sup>1</sup>



Obesity prevalence increased in every state between 2011 and 2021.<sup>2</sup>



Obesity drives over **200 related complications**.<sup>3</sup>



In 2019, U.S. health expenditures tied to obesity exceeded \$173 billion.<sup>4</sup>

### You Can Make Change at Multiple Levels

OMA members and advocates can communicate with and educate elected officials and regulatory and administrative agencies and personnel - institutionally, locally, as well as at federal and state levels to build awareness and support for actions that promote health and access to care for individuals living with obesity and at-risk populations. ### **Key Obesity Treatment & Care Milestones**



2013:

The American Medical Association (AMA) recognizes obesity as a disease state.<sup>5</sup>



2013

The Treat and Reduce Obesity Act (TROA) is introduced in Congress.<sup>6</sup>



2014:

The FDA approves the first GLP-1 agonist for weight loss, Liraglutide.<sup>7</sup>



2017:

AMA begins to use personfirst language around obesity.8



2020

The Department of Veterans Affairs agrees to a contract to use semaglutide for obesity on its formulary.9

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#### **Tailor Your Message to Your Target Audience**

OMA encourages you to personalize the message you are delivering to the legislator or decision-maker you are speaking to about obesity. For example, if you're meeting with a state legislator, you will likely be talking about a state House or Senate bill. If you're sitting down with a Governor or State Insurance Commissioner, your focus is going to be on highlighting gaps in obesity treatment coverage and the societal and economic benefits of providing coverage for obesity treatment services.

### **Customize and Personalize Your Talking Points**

For example, any draft talking points before a state policymaker could follow the below format:

- Your Story: "As an obesity medicine expert..."
- The Stakes: "100 million adults & nearly 15 million children in the United States live with obesity."
- The Call to Action: "Vote for House/Senate Bill XXX, which would...
